Crossings Board Appoints CoExecutive Directors

Meet Candice Wassell and Sherman Lee, the new Co-EDs of The Crossings Community. In this case Co-ED means Co-Executive Director. She received her MDiv from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago in 2013 and currently serves Faith Lutheran Church in O'Fallon, IL.

Candice and Sherman have a working synergy developed over years of friendship from the time Candice served her internship at Bethel Lutheran Church in University City, Missouri where Sherman is a member. They inspire each other and hold one another accountable: Sherman sees the big picture, and Candice asks the practical questions.

He is a theology professor at Fontbonne University in Sherman and Candice report being delighted with the enthusiasm for Crossings they have encountered from those they have met in their first months on the job.
